MANFORD A. AND JUNE SHAW FACULTY PUBLICATION PRIZE

XIUMEI PU & BRENT OLSON

Mountains and Stories–Building Community Among Asian and Pacific Islander Refugee and Immigrant Families in Salt Lake Valley



Xiumei Pu, PhD, is an associate professor of environmental studies. Her teaching interweaves a multitude of thematic threads such as environmental justice, climate resilience, gender and the environment, indigenous environmental

thought, U.S. multiethnic environmental literature, Asian and Asian American environmental literature, ecowomanist and ecofeminist theories, and creative activism. Always evolving, her teaching and research pivot around environmental justice and resilience.



Brent Olson, PhD, is an associate professor of environmental studies and director of the Institute for Mountain Research at Westminster. His research and teaching concern the interaction between culture, political economy, and what

we call nature. He's particularly interested in climate justice, inter-species relationships, and how and where we find hope in the midst of trouble and create spaces for change.

Dr. Xiumei Pu and Dr. Brent Olson collaborated on the 12-episode podcast "Mountains and Stories-Building Community Among Asian and Pacific Islander Refugee and Immigrant Families in Salt Lake Valley." The podcast features the life and work of twelve storytellers from different ethnicities, age groups, and occupations. The podcast is part of a multi-year project funded by a competitive Public Engagement Seed Grant from the Whiting Foundation.

MANFORD A. AND JUNE SHAW FACULTY PUBLICATION PRIZE

GEORGIANA DONAVIN

John Gower's Rhetoric: Classical Authority, Biblical Ethos, and Renaissance Receptions



Georgiana Donavin, PhD, is an expert on 14th century England and its trilingual literature. She is particularly interested in medieval methods for teaching composition. At Westminster College, Donavin teaches courses in mythology,

research methods, medieval literature and Latin language. She particularly enjoys mentoring students in ancient languages and in their own creative and scholarly projects. As co-director of a digital humanities project centered on the 14th century poet John Gower, she works to make the joys of medieval studies accessible to all.

Georgiana Donavin's latest book *John Gower's Rhetoric:* Classical Authority, Biblical Ethos, and Renaissance Receptions represents more than a decade of reading, archival investigation, research into printed materials, translation, writing, and editing. In sum, Professor Donavin would call John Gower's Rhetoric her "career book" because it brings together the major strands of her scholarship: Gower's trilingual 14th century poetry, the history of rhetoric from the classical to the early modern eras, and medieval constructions of the Virgin Mary's role in language education and composition.

EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD OF THE BILL AND VIEVE GORE ENDOWMENT TRUST

JULIA KAMENETZKY

Physics



Julia Kamenetzky, PhD, is an associate professor of physics at Westminster. Prior to this, Dr. Kamenetzky was an National Science Foundation Astronomy & Astrophysics Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Arizona. She completed her MS

and PhD in Astrophysical and Planetary Sciences at the University of Colorado at Boulder and BA in Physics at Cornell College.

Her PhD research focused on molecular gas in star-forming galaxies, primarily using the Herschel SPIRE Fourier Transform Spectrometer, the Atacama Large Millimeter Array (ALMA), and the Arizona Radio Observatory (ARO). She is also involved in light pollution research, variable star monitoring, physics/astronomy education research, advancing the participation of underrepresented groups in STEM, and learning about the interaction between science and public policy.

He has published both academic and general-audience investing articles including an article "Leveraged ETFs: Don't Get Wiped Out By the Tail" that was cited by the Wall Street Journal. He also serves as the faculty advisor to Westminster students competing in the yearly CFA Institute Investment Research Challenge.

PROGRAM NOTES

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic regalia worn today originated in the Middle Ages, when cap, gown, tunic, and hood were ordinary clothing for men of all ranks. Modern academic dress preserves many of the features that conveyed rank and dignity in the Middle Ages. Bachelor's gowns are made of plain cloth and have wide sleeves with pointed ends. Master's gowns have extra-long sleeves with wrist openings in the middle, instead of at the end. Doctor's gowns are adorned with velvet trim. Westminster College's presidential gown and hood are purple and gold, reflecting the school's colors.

The academic hood represents degree level, with doctor's degree holders wearing the longest hood. The color of velvet binding around the hood represents the field in which the wearer earned their degree: humanities, white; business, drab; communication, crimson; education, light blue; fine arts, brown; law, purple; library science, lemon; music, pink; nursing, apricot; philosophy, dark blue; science, golden yellow; public health, salmon pink; and veterinary medicine, gray. The satin lining reflects the academic colors of the institution that awarded the degree.

The braided cords worn by graduates all have distinct meanings.

- Gold cord: Signifies a student graduating Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great praise), or Summa Cum Laude (with highest praise).
- Scarlet cord: Signifies an Honors College graduate who has earned the Honors certificate.
- **Scarlet and gold braided cord:** Signifies an Honors College graduate who has earned the Honors degree.
- Blue and green braided cord: Signifies that the graduate is a member of the Alpha Chi National Honor Society, which honors the top ten percent of junior and senior classes.
- **Purple and white braided cord:** Signifies a nursing graduate who is a member of the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing.
- Red and green braided cord: Signifies achievement in biology scholarship as recognized by the Tri-Beta national office.
- Peacock blue cord: Signifies Service-Learning scholars.
- Silver cord: Signifies donors to the class gift.

CEREMONIAL SYMBOLS

The Presidential Medal of Office, worn by President Dobkin, is passed to each succeeding president of Westminster College. Designed by the O. C. Tanner Company in 1996 for President Stock's inauguration, the medal is a polished-brass, die-cast rendition of Converse Hall, the flagship building for the Westminster College campus.

The ceremonial mace is carried to bring authority to ceremonial occasions and to symbolize the unity and aspirations of the college community. The mace bearer is traditionally a senior faculty member.

AWARDS

The Manford A. and June Shaw Faculty Publication Prize is an annual award made to a Westminster faculty member whose published or exhibited work best represents the faculty's scholarly and professional activity. Dr. Manford A. Shaw was president of Westminster College from 1968 to 1976, a member of the Westminster Board of Trustees for 25 years, and chancellor of the college from 1976 until his death in 1993. The endowment and award have been made possible through generous contributions from his wife, June; his many friends; and his estate.

The Excellence in Teaching Award of the Bill and Vieve Gore Endowment Trust was established to recognize successful teaching over a significant period of time, individual commitment to improve teaching, effectiveness in improving and encouraging student learning, and excellence in classroom or clinical settings. The recipient must be a member of the full-time faculty at Westminster and is selected by their peers.

The Trustee's Character Award is given to a graduating student who has shown exemplary service to the greater community. This student lives the core values of Westminster College and has been a positive role model for their peers with at least a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

The President's Leadership Award is given to a graduating senior with at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA, and who has demonstrated outstanding leadership at Westminster. Their influence, ideals, and activities have raised the standard of excellence and left a positive lasting legacy.

The Neisen R. Bank Memorial Award was established in 1953 by Mr. Neisen R. Bank, a jeweler in Sugar House and a lifetime friend of the college. Since his father's death, Barry Bank, Westminster Class of 1970, has continued this friendship with the college by contributing this award each year.

The Neisen R. Bank Memorial Award is presented to a graduating senior who is a first-generation college student. This individual has demonstrated tenacity and drive in achieving their degree. They have demonstrated academic excellence in learning and/or research. Additionally, they have lived Westminster's core values: academic excellence, respect for diverse people and perspectives, collaboration and teamwork, and personal and social responsibility.

PARTICIPANTS

The Utah Pipe Band was formed in 1939 by Scottish immigrants. The band still adheres to its original constitution, which sets forth its purposes of community service, individual development, and musical excellence.

The readers of the graduate names are Christopher LeCluyse, PhD, Literature, Media, and Writing, and Stephanie Stroud, Theatre.
